Participation of students at the University of Leicester 2022/23

The University of Leicester is clear in its commitment to developing a culture of dignity, respect and inclusion, and creating an environment where difference is valued and respected. The University seeks to provide a positive working and learning environment, free from discrimination, harassment, or victimisation.

Under the Equality Act 2010 we are legally required to produce and publish diversity monitoring information annually. For students at the University, we collect data related to age, disability, sex, ethnicity, religion or belief and sexual orientation.

The Specific duties of the Equality Act 2010 require public bodies to:

- Publish information relating to employees who share protected characteristics
- Publish information relating to people who are affected by the public body's policies and practices (e.g. students)

Collecting diversity data from students allows us to:

- Further understand our student demographic, and support all students. It will allow us to identify specific issues and barriers, and take targeted action.
- Assess the impact of proposed policies and initiatives on different student groups to support decision making.

The data is used to inform the University's actions to create a more inclusive environment, based on statistical evidence. Diversity monitoring information has previously helped us to identify and make positive changes to improve the experiences of some student groups. Examples include facilities on campus such as prayer spaces and events for particular student groups.

Our Commitments to Access and Participation

Access and participation plans set out how higher education providers will improve equity of opportunity for underrepresented groups to access, succeed in and progress from higher education. The plans include: the provider's ambition for change, what it plans to do to achieve that change, the targets it has set, and the investment it will make to deliver the plan.

These detail our expected fee income from Home/EU students and our ambition and strategy to widen participation for the 2020/21-2024/25 academic years.

- In 2022/23, 60.5% of the UoL student population were classified as ≤21, an increase of 3.9% in 2021/22. This remains above the national picture in the sector for 2021/22, in which 47.3% of students studying in UK higher education were classified as ≤21 (Advance HE, 2023 Report).
- Since 2018/19 the proportion of UoL student's ≤21 has fluctuated each year between 56.6% and 63.0%. The vast majority of students at UoL are in the 18-21 age group (Table 1.1, Graph 1.1).

Graph 1.1 All UoL students by age group, 2018/19 to 2022/23





- The vast majority of UoL's UG students, are, as expected, ≤21 (Table 1.2).
- In 2022/23, there was a decrease in the proportion of UoL students classified as over 21 (mature) at UG level, compared with the preceding year 2021/22 (from 12.4% to 11.0%). This is more in line with the proportion of students who were classified aged over 21 (mature) in 2019/20 and 2018/19 (Table 1.2).
- In 2021/22, nationally the proportion of first degree UG students classified as ≤21 was 66.9% (Advance HE, 2023 Report). This is lower than the proportion at UoL which each year has remained above 87.7% since 20220/21 (Table 1.3).
- The proportion of new entrant UoL mature students (aged 21 and over) in 2022/23 was 8.1%, a 3.2% decrease from 2021/22.

Graph 1.2 All UG by age group, 2018/19 to 2022/23





- Disability disclosure rates have steadily increased among students in UK higher education, rising from 5.4% in 2003/04 to 15.9% in 2021/22 (Advance HE, 2023 Report).
- In 2022/23, 11.3% of UoL's students declared a disability. Although the proportion of students declaring a disability is at its highest in the last five academic years (see Table 2.1, Graph 2.1), this is lower than the national picture.
- The proportion of students whose disability status is 'unknown' increased by 0.6% from 1.0% in 2021/22 to 1.6% in 2022/23.



- Since 2018/19, we have seen considerable growth (increase of 12.6%) in the proportion of UoL students who identified as minority ethnic (Table 3.1, Graph 3.1). In 2022/23 63.2% of all UoL students identified as minority ethnic, a substantial increase from 52.1% in 2020/21.
- In 2021/22, 27.0% of the UK domiciled student population identified as minority ethnic (Advance HE, 2023 Report). UoL continues to have a significantly higher proportion of minority ethnic students than the sector average.
- Each academic year we have seen a slight decrease in the proportion of UoL students who have not declared their ethnicity (from 3.6% in 2018/19 to 2.9% in 2022/23).

Graph 3.2 Breakdown of UoL Students by ethnicity 2019/20 to 2022/23



- The majority of UoL students identified as either Asian or Asian British (41.4% in 2022/23) or White (34.0%).
- Since 2020/21, the proportion of Asian or Asian British UoL students has increased by 10.2% to 41.4% in 2022/23 (Table 3.2, Graph 3.2).
- Of the total UoL minority ethnic students in 2022/23, the largest majority 39.3% were Indian. This is an increase of 18.9% from 20.4% in 2019/20 (Table 3.3).
- 13.4% of all UoL students in 2022/23 identified as Black or Black British, an increase from 12.1% in 2021/22 (Table 3.2). Of these students, most identified as being from a Black African background (17.4%). Black Caribbean students continue to be less represented, constituting 2.4% of minority ethnic students overall at UoL in 2022/23 (Table 3.3).
- Nationally in 2021/22, 42.9% of minority ethnic UK domiciled students were Asian, of which the large majority were Pakistani (14.1%) and Indian (13.0%). 6.9% of minority ethnic students were Bangladeshi and 8.8% were from other Asian backgrounds. 29.6% were Black, most of whom were from a Black African background (22.8% of total minority ethnic UK domiciled students). Black Caribbean students were much less represented, and constituted 5.3% of minority ethnic UK domiciled students overall. 16.7% of minority ethnic UK domiciled students were from a mixed background, 2.9% were Chinese, and 4.6% identified as other ethnic background (Advance HE, 2023 Report).



- The proportion of UoL students reporting no religion or belief has continued to decrease each academic year since 2019/20 (42.6%) to 30.6% in 2022/23 (Table 4.1, Graph 4.1).
- The proportion of Hindu students at UoL has continued to increase over the last five years, with the most considerable increase from 7.6% in 2020/21 to 14.6% in 2022/23. This remains noticeably higher than the national figure in 2021/22, in which the proportion of UK higher education students who reported their religion as Hindu was 4.2% (Advance HE, 2023 Report).
- Since 2018/19, the proportion of Muslim students at UoL has increased by 4.7%, from 11.6% to 16.3% in 2022/23.
- The proportion of Sikh students at UoL has increased in the last four years, from 3.0% in 2019/20 to 5.3% in 2022/23. This is higher than the national figure in 2021/22, in which 1.0% of students in UK higher education reported their religion as Sikh (Advance HE, 2023 2023).
- Since 2020/21, there has been a decrease in the proportion of Christian students at UoL, from 27.8% to 24.2% in 2022/23.
- Nationally, Advance HE reported that the three religion or belief groups with the highest proportions of students in 2020/21, were no religion or belief (43.8%), Christian (28.7%) and Muslim (10.6%) (Advance HE, 2023 Report).

Graph 4.1 All UoL students by religion or belief, 2018/19 to 2022/23





- There has been a 1% increase in the proportion of female students studying at UoL in 2022/23 (52.5%) compared to 51.5% in 2021/22. Female continue to make up the majority of students studying at UoL (Table 5.1, Graph 5.1).
- The higher proportion of female students compared to male students studying at UoL, aligns with the national picture in UK higher education. In 2021/22, 57.3% of all students studying in UK higher education were female (Advance HE, 2023 Report).

- The proportion of students at UoL identifying as LGB+ has increased in the last five years by 4.1%, from 5.8% in 2018/19 to 9.9% in 2022/23 (Table 6.1/Graph 6.1).
- The University first started recording sexual orientation in 2015/16 and the proportion of students who have 'not declared' their sexual orientation has continued to decrease each year. There have been fluctuations in the proportion of students who selected 'information refused' over the last five academic years.
