





Protocol for rapid evidence assessment: Understanding how multi-agency communication influences victim-survivors of VAWG's engagement in criminal justice process.

Key aims:

The key aims of this rapid evidence assessment is to:

- Understand how survivors experience multi-agency communication and what works well or creates barriers in relation to this.
- Understand the impact of multi-agency communication on victim-survivors' engagement in criminal justice processes.

Literature search strategy:

Searches within the databases will have in scope the following VAWG offences: domestic abuse, sexual assault/rape, stalking, child abuse, female genital mutilation (FGM), and forced marriage

Individual practice/research organisations will be searched for research/practice findings regarding VAWG specific to their organisation.

Database method:

First 50 articles returned from the search to be searched for studies that fit the inclusion criteria.





All searching inclusion/Exclusion criteria:

• Original research to include samples of survivors of domestic abuse, sexual assault/rape, stalking, child abuse, female genital mutilation (FGM), and forced marriage

Database searching additional criteria.

To include:

- Peer-reviewed papers only
- Papers published between 2013-2023
- Original research and review/meta-analyses
- English language

To exclude:

• Book chapters, non-peer reviewed articles

Data to be extracted from the studies

- Publication reference
- Sample details
- Findings/themes regarding survivors' experiences of communication, and more specifically where multiple agencies were involved.

Pilot research

Research question: How do survivors experience multi-agency communication and does this impact on their engagement with criminal justice process?

Methods: Small group focus groups/One-to-one interviews. This will involve a small number of survivors across the three regions and plans to involve both children/young people and adults.
