4. Registration periods:

The normal period of registration for the MSc is two years and the maximum registration is four years

The normal period of registration for the Postgraduate Certificate is one year and the maximum period of registration is two years

5. Typical entry requirements:

Candidates should normally have either a first or a second class honours degree from a British university or its equivalent. Special consideration will be given to those who have no first degree but an acceptable professional qualification coupled with practical experience. An applicant who has at least five years' practical experience and borderline qualifications may be considered or asked to complete the Department's entry test.

Where English is not the first language of the candidate, the successful applicant must have either IELTS 6.5 or TOEFL 250 (computer) or 600 (paper).

6. Accreditation of Prior Learning:

No automatic accreditation. Applications are reviewed on a case by case basis in accordance with university policy should module exemption be requested.

7. Programme aims:

The key learning objectives of the programme are that by the end of the programme students will have developed and enhanced skills and abilities to:

- understand and apply theories and models of policing, including the ability to undertake conceptual analysis, to assess critically different theoretical perspectives and to develop testable propositions.
- report on and critically interpret research on police studies, including the ability to interpret research findings and relates these to alternative theoretical propositions.
- understand key perspectives on leadership and management and be able to apply these to the particular context of contemporary policing. In particular they will recognise the key features of policing which require specific types and styles of leadership and management.

- use local and international information services effectively, including the ability to use documentary sources, libraries and archives, databases and other information held on computers and through the internet.
- appreciate and understand the people and organisations dimensions of management, including planning and decision making, organising, leading and controlling the use of information.
