Foodbank Support Initiative

HumanKind – a collaboration between the Research Centre for Museums and Galleries and Calke Abbey – explores the role of culture in tackling social isolation and loneliness. At the heart of the project (<https://humankind.le.ac.uk/>) is a desire to foster human connection, compassion and small acts of kindness.

Building on work to date, the Research Centre for Museums and Galleries was planning a large scale food collection during June 2020, inviting staff and students to give help to the Leicester South Foodbank who support the 1 in 5 of the UK population who live in poverty.

With the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic and closure of the University campus it is no longer possible to collect food donations as planned. At the same time, South Leicester Foodbank is experiencing a 300% increase in demand.

To support the foodbank at this critical time, RCMG is inviting students and staff to consider making a donation via online donation.
